THE RIDE

The 2021 ride will feature a long (100 miles), a medium (70 miles) and a short route (40 miles). All routes will start and end at Harrow School, with the long and medium rides breaking at West Wycombe.


Cyclists of all abilities are invited to take part in one of these three fully supported rides. A team from Iconic Cycling Events will mark up the routes and provide route files and guide maps. Riders will navigate independently around the course.

If you are a confident rider and comfortable navigating a group, we would welcome you as a ride captain for the day.

WHO WE ARE SUPPORTING

Every penny raised from the Long Ducker Bike Ride 2021 will go towards supporting the most vulnerable young people in our society. The main charity recipient this year will again be Young Harrow Foundation. Through Young Harrow Foundation, funds raised from last year's Bike Ride made possible a robust programme for people facing the greatest challenges, and significantly improved the life chances of some of our most marginalised and vulnerable young people.

Together, the Long Ducker sports festival and the Long Ducker Bike Ride raised nearly £250,000 to help over 1,500 young people across Harrow and north-west London. By the end of the year, with extra funding, the total raised and given away will be around half a million pounds. We hope that even more will be raised for the Young Harrow Foundation, the Harrow Club and other young people's charities this year.



SHAFTESBURY ENTERPRISE

Shaftesbury Enterprise encompasses all of Harrow's philanthropic, charitable, outreach and partnership work, and is fundamental to the identity of Harrow School. This stems from the founding of the School as part of a Royal Charter Corporation in 1572. Harrow's outward-looking activity helps the School fulfil the original charitable aims of its founder, John Lyon. It also helps Harrovians to understand that we all have responsibilities, and that there is much fulfilment to be found in forging strong relationships with those around us.
